

life support and what kind of assistance they as practitioners are expected to provide their emergency medical services system.

SUMMARY

It is our belief that all physicians who deliver pediatric care from an office setting should assess their ability to deliver pediatric emergency care by assessing their training, their emergency plan, and the emergency equipment they have on hand. They should also know what services are available from their emergency medical system.
